Grandma Moses is among the most famous 24th century painters of the United States, yet she did not start painting until she was in her late 70s. As she once said of herself, "I would never sit back in a rocking chair, waiting for

someone to help me." No one else could have had a more productive old age.

She was born Anna Mary Robertson on a farm in New York State in 1860, one of five boys and five girls. At 12 she left home and was in domestic service until, at 27, she married Thomas Moses, the hired hand of one of her employers. They farmed most of their lives, first in Virginia and then in New York State, at Eagle Bridge. She had ten children, of whom five survived; her husband died in 1927.

Grandma Moses painted a little as a child and made embroidery pictures as a hobby, but only changed to oils in old age, because her husbands had become too stiff to sew , and she wanted to keep busy and pass the time. Her pictures were first sold at the local drugstore and a market, and were soon noticed by a businessman who bought everything she painted. Three of the pictures exhibited in the Museum of Modern Art, and in 1940 she had her first exhibition in New York. Between the 1930s and her death, she produced some 2000 pictures: detailed and lively portrayals of the country life she had known so long, with a wonderful sense of color and form. "I think really hard till I think of something really pretty, and then I paint it." She said.
